**Yesterday World** - offers visitors a unique insight into the past; cleverly created through a series of vividly recreated walk through displays

**Bodiam Castle** - The appearance of Bodiam Castle is exactly how most people imagine a medieval castle should look like, with its square of walls, a round tower at each corner, and a square tower midway along each wall, entirely surrounded by a moat.
